How to give a Homoeopathic Remedy

Homoeopathic remedies are very easy to administer. The remedy itself is coated around the little sugar pill. Find the **simplest** way that works to give to your pet.

Here are some guide lines:

As a general rule, try to **avoid handling the pill**.

Tip **one** pill from the **bottle** into the **lid**.

Now follow **one** of the suggestions below:

- You can tip the pill into the animals mouth direct. The remedy is absorbed when the pill touches the membranes of the mouth.
- You can put one pill in a small glass of water & stir well. The liquid then takes on the activity of the remedy. Then simple administer a few drops of the solution onto the lips or gums.
- Similarly you can put the pill into a fresh syringe or a dropper bottle. Shake well, then give a few drops by mouth.
- If you have only one pet, then you can tip a pill into the drinking water & stir well. The pet will dose themselves each time they go for a drink.
- Finally, if you find the above difficult, you can mix with a bit of food. If doing this, then best to make up the remedy with water first, then put a few teaspoons of the solution over the food before giving to you pet.
